Army commander says Phuket must get rid of 'mafia' and 'powerful people'

THE new Army Region 4 commander has announced his agenda for Phuket, ticking off a list of at least a dozen problems he feels need urgent resolution.

During his visit last week, Lt Gen Piyawat Nakwanit said that he was "generally satisfied with the state of tourism in Phuket", but that getting rid of 'powerful people' and officers who unlawfully practice their duties would set Phuket on the path to progress.

"Our biggest priority should be to stop 'mafia' and other so-called 'powerful people' from using their influence to benefit themselves illegally at the expense of others. It is imperative that we get rid of these people," said the general.

Several government and private sector officers joined the meeting at Phuket Provincial Hall, where the issues under discussion ranged from beach management, public transport management and public land encroachment, to human trafficking, immigration, illegal tour guides and security.

One of the major issues Gen Piyawat focused on was public land encroachment.

This has been a long-standing issue in Phuket and we need to resolve it urgently. For instance, Surin Beach was declared as a beach of honor, so we have to take measures to keep it in its 'virgin' state. Cherng Talay *OrBorTor* has to take steps to resolve this," said Gen Piyawat.

Last month, Cherng Talay OrBorTor President Ma-ann Samran announced plans to build a gate surrounding the beach as well as a walking street to allow local vendors to sell their wares there.

'Encroachment is also prevalent at other Phuket beaches, including Laem Singh. There are about 33 more protected areas that officers must keep an eye on in order to prevent mismanagement and public land

abuse," Gen Piyawat added.

Another issue on the agenda was public transportation management and airport management. Gen Piyawat discussed a number of problem areas, such as driving licences, drivers' dressing, parking area management, checking the condition of vehicles and adjusting the price of public

The general added that every vehicle and driver to enter and exit the airport should be screened for security.

'Every driver must have a card and their information should be available with police for their records. The immigration checkpoint service also needs improvement – service must be fast and convenient, both outside and inside the airport. Effective solution to these issues requires all officers to help each other," he said.

Gen Piyawat also appreciated the efforts of all Phuket officers, adding that he wanted Phuket to be a 'model tourism province' and that unless concrete steps

were taken in the right direction, this would be difficult to achieve. Briefly, these included focusing on public benefit before anything else; coming together of all parties to solve problems; strictly checking and monitoring government officials for unlawful activities such as accepting tea money; and announcing promotional campaigns for public projects to inform locals and tourists of progress on the island.

Phuket Governor Norraphat Plodthong said he would do what's in the island's best

"We have been working very hard to tackle all of these issues. I have just launched several projects to improve Phuket, including boosting cleanliness, sports activities for youth, waste management policies, and boosting security," said Gov Norraphat.

"All of these will further the agenda of sustainable development of Phuket as an international city," he added.

Man charged after fatal headon collision

ONE man was killed while three others were severely injured after a speeding pick-up truck and a Toyota sedan collided, sending both vehicles into a roadside waterway in Krabi on May 1.

The car was carrying three people – driver Suphachai Limtrakil, 69, his wife Anchalee Sriwittayabancha, 42, and their 14-year-old daughter. Mr Suphachai was

The truck was driven by Pornthanakrit Tunyasook.

We found the totaled Toyota in the waterway along Petchkasem Road. Rescue workers had to use heavy machinery to cut open its roof and extract the body of Mr Suphachai," said Lt Col Danaithorn Jaisabai of Klongthom Police.

All three survivors sustained serious injuries and were taken to Klongthom Hospital for treatment.

"Witnesses told us that they saw Mr Pornthanakrit drive his pick-up into Mr Suphachai's car after crossing the road median from the opposite direction.

Mr Pornthanakrit was later charged with reckless driving causing death and injury.

"A witness at the restaurant told us that Mr Thongchai had complained about the hot weather and had said that he wished he could 'jump into water' before going inside the room," added Capt Boonnam.

The victim's body was taken to Samui Hospital for further examination to confirm the cause of death.

Couple stuck with B6.7mn 'horror' house

DAMRONGDHAMA center staff and representatives of the Engineering Institute of Thailand on April 27 inspected a 'questionable' housing project in Koh Kaew.

The house, backed by a well-known developer, has reportedly been in shambles for about three years.

Sintichai Jitkam and Sunisa

Jitkham in November last year filed a complaint after purchasing the house in the development for 6.7 million baht. They additionally filed photos of water leaks from the ceiling and other structural problems that they said could be hazardous.

The developer responded to the original complaint by fixing some problems, but the couple explained that more issues had popped up and demanded a refund. However, they were offered temporary housing at another project instead.

"We noticed during inspection that some of the problems in the house had been fixed. Our specialist engineer and other officials will further inspect the house and offer a maintenance plan to the developer," said Nanthasak Boonnak, director of the Damrongdhama Center.

Officials refused to disclose the name of the development, which is located nearby the British International School Phuket. No further updates were made available from the Damrongdhama center.

One killed in collision with Korean expat

A YOUNG Thai man was killed on April 27 after smashing into a Korean expat's pickup truck in Phuket Town.

Maj Nattaya Suwanpong of Phuket City Police received reports of the incident at about 11pm. It occurred at the Thepkrasattri-Nakhon road junction near Phuket Wittayalai School.

"The motorcyclist, Siraphan Sampaorat, 20, was lying in a pool of blood on the road when we arrived. He was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital and later pronounced dead. He was not wearing a helmet and sustained severe injuries to his head and legs," said Maj Nattaya.

Both vehicles were damaged. However, expat Cheolhee Park remained uninjured.

"Witnesses told us that the motorcyclist was riding on Thepkrasattri Road while the Korean driver was coming from the opposite direction. They said that at the junction Mr Park attempted to make a sudden right turn, which caused Mr Siraphan to crash into the truck," the policeman said.

"We will check CCTV footage and question Mr Park further before charging him,"

Governor kicks off term by | School teacher keeping 'clean-up' promise injured in crash

PHUKET Governor Norraphat Plodthong on May 1 launched a campaign titled 'Clean Phuket with our Hands and Hearts', as promised during his first 'Governor meets Media' gathering at Phuket Provincial Hall last month.

The week-long campaign will be held each month, the governor stated.

"As Phuket is an international tourism destination, it is vital for us to be clean," Governor Norraphat stated during a visit to the Regional Center of the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation last week.

He added that the goal of the campaign was to reduce garbage in public places such as fresh markets, canals, beaches, roads, public parks and public toilets. He also addressed other problem areas, including the island's messy, cartoon-like overhead cables, stray dogs and the drug culture among teenagers.

Representatives from a number of public offices joined the campaign, including the Phuket

Public Health Office; the Phuket office of the Natural Resources and Environment Department; the Phuket Provincial Administration Office; the Phuket Rural Roads Office: the Department of Public Works and Town & Country Planning; the Phuket Provincial Electricity Authority; the Phuket Livestock Office; the

Phuket Primary Education Service; and various schools and universities

Throughout the week, participants gathered at Saphan Hin at 8am and then split up into groups to tackle each area.

We will have regular evaluations to see how effective the campaign is," Gov Norraphat concluded.

At this stage, police have yet to press charges and are waiting to question Ms Mari when she recovers.

BKK to have stricter street food controls

THE City Hall chief has stated that by May 31 street food vendors on Khao San and Yaowarat roads will be managed by stricter regulations to ensure clean and hygienic food preparation.

However, more roads could be allowed to serve street food like those two famous roads, Bangkok Governor Pol General Assawin Kwanmuang was quoted saying by the Thai National News Bureau.

Khao San Road and one traffic lane of Yaowarat Road will be closed from 6pm until midnight to allow the sale of street food, he said.

Street food vendors must wear aprons, hats and gloves every time they handle food.

The Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) will designate areas for washing and disposal of waste.


The governor said the Ministry of Commerce would control prices and would require street food vendors to clearly display price tags in Thai, English and Chinese.

The Ministry of Labor will be responsible for street food vendors who hire migrant workers.

The governor added that the BMA was considering managing street food on other roads like Khao San and Yaowarat roads.

Three arrested for bank theft with fake bomb

POLICE have arrested two men and a teenager for allegedly robbing a Nonthaburi bank of 300,000 baht using a fake bomb in a crime one suspect said they had copied from a video clip that when viral on YouTube.

Provincial Police Bureau 1 Deputy Commissioner Maj Gen Thanayut Wutthitratthamrong and Nonthaburi Police Chief Maj Gen Susak

Prakkamakul announced the arrests on May 1.

The suspects were identified as Somkiart Udombitisakul, 37, his 17-year-old-son, and Wanchai Khunsri, 37.

They are accused of using a fake bomb to rob a branch of the Thanachart Bank at Center Point near the Central West Gate in Nonthaburi's Bang Yai district on April 20, making off

with 301,660 baht.

Police seized the fake bomb but retrieved only 2,880 baht from the suspects, who claimed they had spent the rest of the money.

Following the robbery, police checked CCTV footage and saw two robbers flee in a car. A licence-plate check confirmed that the car belonged to Mr Wanchai, who was arrested at his house in Pathum Thani.

Media reform bill changeable, says Dep PM

DEPUTY Prime Minister Wissanu Krea-ngam said on May 2 that it was possible for the government to disagree with the media regulation draft bill proposed by the National Reform Steering Assembly (NRSA) before it forwarded the document to the Council of the State, its legal arm, to amend.

The media asked Wissanu about that possibility before attending the Cabinet meeting.

Dep PM Wissanu said every draft bill was subject for review to determine if they were in line with the constitution and those they were not would be scrapped.

He said he could not say if the media regulation draft bill violated the new charter's Article 35, which guaranteed press freedom, as he had not seen the bill.

He said he had no problem discussing the issue with media representatives. However, the government had not yet received the draft bill.

The NRSA voted in favor of the draft bill on May 2 despite

the media labelling the bill an infringement on press freedom, including via the proposed media professional council.

Red Bull heir skips town before warrant

VORAYUTH "Boss" Yoovidhya, the fugitive heir to the Red Bull fortune who is being sought to hear the prosecutors' indictment in relation to running over and killing a police officer in 2012, entered Thailand on April 23 and departed on April 25 for Singapore, Immigration Police revealed on May 2.

An arrest warrant was issued for Mr Vorayuth last week following his failure to meet prosecutors for a decision on his indictment a day earlier.

Immigration Bureau chief Lt Gen Natthorn Phrosunthorn said his office could check people travelling in and out of the country and if Mr Vorayuth re-entered Thailand the system would alert them.

He explained that Mr Vorayuth had left the country before the arrest warrant was issued.

He said Thong Lor Police investigators did not ban him from travelling abroad as the case stemmed from recklessness rather than a serious case with criminal intent. Therefore, he said, the Immigration Bureau was not authorized to stop him.

Police arrest transvestites for 'sex trade'

POLICE arrested six transvestites for allegedly propositioning tourists in Tha Phae Gate area in downtown Chiang Mai on the night of May 1.

Officers checked the area after receiving complaints that many transvestites in revealing dresses were working as prostitutes in the area.

Police located the transvestites just after midnight.

Police nabbed six of the alleged sex workers, said Lt Sathaporn Watthakorn, deputy crime suppression inspector at Muang Chiang Mai Police Station

He said the arrested transvestites were aged over 20.

They were charged with trying to pressure people in a public place into buying a sex service, and thus had committed a shameful act in public.

Tragic end to a young life

PHUKET was in the international news spotlight again last week, this time for the heartbreaking murder of an 11-monthold baby girl, hanged by her own father in Nai Thon.

Most readers will already be familiar with the tragically short life of Natalee 'Biw' Wongtalay, whose execution went viral after her late father, 21, chose to post it on Facebook Live before taking his own life.

There are so many angles to pursue on such a story that it is difficult to know where to begin. Perhaps it is best to start by at least attempting to keep things in some kind of perspective, as difficult as that may seem.

As horrific as the murder was, the sad reality is that young men driven to insane jealousy have been perpetrating atrocities from time immemorial. Such jealousy is an incredibly powerful force that can flip an otherwise sane individual into the uncharted realms of unpredictable, violent behavior.

In this day and age, we tend to be bombarded with 'public awareness' slogans. Smokers now not only have to endure 'Smoking Kills' slogans on their cigarette packs, but also graphic representations of what some of the potential outcomes might be. We are also reminded daily of numerous other threats, both real and perceived.

Yet the single greatest immediate threat to young women around the globe comes not from 'second-hand smoke', or other perceived dangers, but a testosterone-driven male partner in fear of, or in the process of, being dumped.

Thai soap opera culture plays a particularly interesting role in all this. Female leads typically dish out the hurt by slapping one another in the face, or through similar such outbursts, while their male counterparts remain quiet, composed pillars of virtue.

In stark contrast, real Thai women of every age should be made better aware of the potential dangers posed by a jealousy fuelled young male. They need to be dealt with just as delicately as a time bomb in the process of being defused.

We do not know the exact course of events that led to this tragedy, or if the victim's now-widowed mom could have handled the situation better, but we nevertheless offer her and her family our condolences after such a horrible loss.

Rest in Peace, Nong Biw.

Koh Lipe: The Maldives of Thailand

Footloose

KOH LIPE is situated in the Andaman Sea, about 85 kilometers off the coast of Satun Province. The tiny island is part of the Adang-Rawi archipelago. In recent years Koh Lipe has grown to become a popular destination among backpackers and travellers looking for the raw and authentic island experience.

Unlike some of the more familiar islands in Phang Nga Bay, Koh Lipe is quite far from Phuket, which adds to its appeal since it is off the beaten trail and still untouched by mass tourism. The downside being that it's a bit of a trek to get there in the first place.

The easiest and most frequently picked travel itinerary to Koh Lipe would be to book a flight to Hat Yai Airport. There are frequent flights from Bangkok to Hat Yai daily. However there is only one major airline that serves the Phuket-Hat Yai route, which makes the flight from Phuket a bit pricey. The alternative

would be to catch a bus or a van from Phuket.

Once in Hat Yai, visitors can catch a bus or van to Pak Bara, a port in Satun. Speedboats leave Pak Bara on a regular basis headed for Koh Tarutao and Lipe. The journey can take up to an hour and a half but it is a splendid trip across one of the most pristine environments in the Andaman region. Lucky visitors may be able to catch a glimpse of migrating whales or

dolphins between Tarutao and Adang-Rawi.

Koh Lipe is one of the few islands within the archipelago of Adang-Rawi and Tarutao, which is not entirely part of the marine national park. Hence the island has a range of accommodations on offer, from huts and beach bungalows to hotel rooms. The beaches are stunning and the tiny town is vibrant with plenty of shops, restaurants and dessert cafes.

ATM machines are a bit harder to come by so it is worth taking a bit of spare cash with you.

At night visitors can find cool bars and hangout spots at almost all the beaches on the island.

One of the most popular activities on Koh Lipe is snorkeling and scuba diving, and for good reason. The waters around Koh Lipe boast some of the region's healthiest and most vibrant reefs. The coral reefs surrounding Koh Lipe are mostly part of the pro-

tected marine national park. Some operators offer nighttime snorkeling tours to watch luminescent plankton.

The islands surrounding Koh Lipe are also very interesting to visit. Adang and Rawi are both part of the marine national park. Both are fairly larger than Koh Lipe and are covered with dense tropical jungles and lined with white sandy beaches.

It is easy for visitors from Koh Lipe to visit some of these magnificent islands. Koh Tarutao is a bit further away, but definitely worth a stopover if time permits. There are also regular ferry services from Koh Lipe to Langkawi Island in Malaysia.

The best time to visit Koh Lipe is from November till April. During this period the Andaman Sea is calm, making boat journeys a bit more pleasant. Visitors are also less likely to encounter bad weather and rain.

Although development is quickly catching up with the tourism boom, Koh Lipe still maintains its authentic charm and natural beauty. It is a long journey to make, but definitely worth it.

The company is based on the same concept of sharing accommodation service, but it differs in the details, said Suchada Taechotirote, co-founder and chief executive officer of Favstay.


It aims to focus on service to enable guests have a comprehensively comfortable experience.

Above and beyond the call of duty

KORATHAK Kissanasakul, better known as Kai, is a taxi driver and tourism business operator in Phuket. Originally from Satun, he moved to Phuket about 18 years ago, where he met his wife who is a Phuket native.

His first job was as a guest service officer at Katathani Phuket Beach Resort about 15 years ago. He then moved to Sheraton Grande Laguna Phuket (now Angsana Laguna Phuket), where he again worked in guest service relations. Altogether, he has about five years of experience in the hospitality industry.

"I studied at Prince of Songkla University, Surat Thani campus, where I majored in tourism and hotel management. I enjoyed studying about and working in the tourism industry as it was a satisfying and competitive field. However, after the 2004 tsunami, things went very quiet in tourism, at least for a while. Phuket had been badly impacted and we needed time to rebuild," says Kai.

"That is when I heard about an opportunity working aboard

a cruise ship named 'Grand Princess' from a friend of mine. The company was American and operated 16 cruiseliners under the name 'Princess Cruises'. I was hired for a 10-month-contract."

Working aboard a cruise ship gave him the opportunity to travel to many countries, which is something he is still thankful for.

"We visited Turkey, Spain, Italy, France, Greece, Portugal, and several other places. I met a lot of people I would never have met otherwise. My cabinmate was Mexican and I learnt to speak a little Spanish and Italian as well. This was a very unique opportunity – not many people get to travel this much. I always preferred to take the night shift, so I would have time to travel and explore new cities each time we ported at a new destination," says Kai.

However, working aboard a cruise ship was not something to be taken lightly, as Kai soon discovered.

"It was extremely hard work. We had to be on duty 24/7. Every year, we got about two months off and then it was back to the ship. I worked for two contracts but after that I decided to go back home to my family. It was especially hard because at that time there was no Facebook, video chat or any other means to keep in touch. It was very difficult to communicate with my wife because I was in different countries all the time. She had to wake up in the middle of the night just so we could talk on the phone," he says.

After moving back to Phuket, Kai landed a job at Toyota in sales and service, which he held for five years.

However, to achieve a better work-life balance, he started driving his own taxi.

"Once I started out, I found that I was getting plenty of return guests – people recommended me to their friends and my client base grew. I have been doing this for about two years now and have also started a tour company by the name of 'Phuket Attraction Trips'. I thought it would be better to provide more choices to my customers," says Kai.

Kai then developed a website, obtained a tourism licence from the government and placed brochures in his car for customers
